WSC Q. 55. What is forbidden in the third commandment?

A. The third commandment forbiddeth all profaning or abusing of anything whereby God maketh himself known.

The third commandment involves taking the name of the Lord “in vain.” We do this, the catechism tells us, when we speak ill of “anything whereby God maketh himself known.” One application of this is the way that people often speak ill of the church. Many despise the church, either with their words or their actions (such as frequent non-attendance to worship, or speaking ill of fellow believers). But the church is the bride of Christ, the vehicle for the blessings and promises of the gospel, the means “whereby God maketh himself known.”
