### CATECHISM CORNER

# WSC Q. 58. What is required in the fourth commandment?

A. The fourth commandment requireth the keeping holy to God such set times as he hath appointed in his Word; expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy sabbath to himself.

What does it mean for us to keep Sabbath? Many Christians disagree one what this would mean for us. There are two errors that we frequently fall into. First, many Christians ignore the Sabbath altogether as a vestige of the Old Testament Law – no long relevant for us. One day is treated the same as another – all days are fit for work (or play). This will lead to problems: the loss of a rhythm in worship or a failure to rest from ceaseless labors is harmful to the soul. The other danger is an overly strict Sabbatarian understanding – like the Pharisees in Jesus' day. If the Sabbath just becomes a legalistic set of rules we miss the point badly.
